Elkins Elementary School is nestled at the foothills of the Yolla Bolly Mountains. We are a single school district in rural Northern California, located in Tehama County approximately 20 miles west of Interstate 5.

Elkins was founded in 1872 and has seen many changes since that time. Presently we have fifteen students in grades K-8. With the small school, "family" setting, we are able to offer customized instruction to our students to best meet their individual needs.

Site Council meets bi-monthly beginning in September. The Site Council is composed of staff members and parents. Site Council serves as the Elkins LCAP advisory committee.

Monthly Board meetings provided Board awareness of LCAP goals, actions and budget.

Annual Update:

Elkins staff and Site Council reviewed and analyzed LCAP data and actions for effectiveness. For the 2015-16 school year, the Elkins LCAP reduced the number of goals to two. This worked well for the school and for parents. These two goals will advance to future years.

SERRF was successful. Other 2015-16 LCAP actions/services remain relevant and will advance to future years.

Annual Update:

SERRF was highly successful.

Chromebooks were added and the school now has adequate devices for instruction and testing.

Internet access was accomplished and functioning.

There is a need for staff professional development in technology.

There is a need for improving student learning outcomes in math computation, reading inferences and writing.

Elkins has no English Learners at this time.

There is a concern over chronic absenteeism for one student; no students achieved perfect attendance in 2015-16.

There are no additional changes in the LCAP as a result of written comments or feedback.

The Elkins School is a very small, rural school (16 children) with high percentage of low -income students (94% for the 2015-16 school year). This justifies our supplemental/concentration monies to be used to address students needs school-wide. Elkins students will receive highly individualized and personalized instruction in all core content areas regardless of their income, family background and/or language status. Activities using supplemental/concentration monies to include 1.) additional tutoring to identified students (one additional hour per day/5 days a week = 5 additional hours per school week), 2.) paraeducator support in the classroom 5 days/week, 6.5 hours/day, 3.) partial cost for internet access for instructional use, and 4) support funding for the SERRF program via portion of custodial and PGE costs.

This year (2016-17) Elkins Elementary is projecting a high percentage of low income students, based upon the low income percentage in 2015-16 (over 94% of students qualifying for Free/Reduced). As such, we have chosen to spend our funding school-wide for ALL students! The 28.80% of improved and/or increased services for Elkins students will address the need for additional instruction in ELA and Math (one additional hour/day X 5 days a week representing 17% increased instructional service), additional instructional support for the regular classroom day (6.5 hours of support/day or 100% additional service), and the cost of internet access for all students.
